

Overview of holdings – Works Archive / Company Archive

- **Cast steel factory/Group management** 1842–1999, approx. 5,000 linear meters

Records of the company management as well as of plants and departments of the cast steel factory/Group management relating to all areas of the company, records of foreign representatives and of company welfare institutions.

Collections of contracts, land purchase deeds and concession deeds, of circulars and press releases, of newspaper clippings relating to Krupp, and of annual reports from the entire Krupp Group.

- **Bergwerke Krupp (Krupp mines)**, 1853–1980, 2.0 linear meters

Krupp Bergwerke Essen, especially the Helene-Amalie colliery: fragmentary holdings concerning ownership, technical equipment, output, sales, and personnel matters.

Finding aids: card index Further records are held by the Bergbau-Archiv (mining archive), Bochum.

- **Schlesische Nickelwerke, Frankenstein (Silesian nickel works)** 1890–1943, 0.4 linear meters

Fragmentary holdings on the history of the Gewerkschaft Schlesische Nickelwerke, established in 1894 and acquired by Fried. Krupp AG in 1915.

- **Hüttenwerk Rheinhausen/Friedrich-Alfred-Hütte, Rheinhausen** 1897–1989, approx. 400 linear meters

Old archive of the Friedrich-Alfred-Hütte ironworks, established in 1897 as Hüttenwerk Rheinhausen, arranged by pertinence, with records on all areas, 1897–1960.

Management records and records of various offices concerning commercial and technical matters, production, and association activities.

- **Archive of the Bochumer Verein für Gussstahlfabrikation AG / Krupp Stahl AG Bochum** 1854–1993, approx. 420 linear meters

Old archive of the Bochumer Verein für Gussstahlfabrikation AG, merged in 1965 with Fried. Krupp Hüttenwerke AG, renamed Krupp Stahl AG, Bochum, in 1980, arranged by pertinence with records on all areas, 1854–1965.

Management records and records of various offices of Fried. Krupp Hüttenwerke AG and Krupp Stahl AG, 1965–1993.

Finding aids: card indexes, archive plan, electronic finding aid

- **Stahlwerke Südwestfalen AG** 1947–1991, approx. 60 linear meters
Records of Stahlwerke Südwestfalen AG, merged with Krupp Stahl AG in 1984, and of some subsidiaries.
Finding aids: finding aid The records of the predecessor companies are held by the Stiftung Westfälisches Wirtschaftsarchiv (Westphalian business archives foundation).
- **Sayner Hütte with Mülhofener Hütte near Bendorf/Rhein** 1816–1887, approx. 150 archival units
Records of the Sayner Hütte ironworks, established in 1769/70 by the Elector and Archbishop of Trier, later owned by the Prussian state, and acquired by Krupp in 1865.
Records, mainly from the Prussian period, on the general activity of the works, cost and budget planning, technical equipment, and production.

- **Hermannshütte near Neuwied** 1901/02–1922/23, 1 linear meter
Ledgers of the ironworks established in 1857 by "Weilburger Bergbaugesellschaft Louis Vogts & Co.", Duisburg, and purchased by Krupp in 1871.

- **Stahlwerk Annen, Annen near Witten** 1872–1925, approx. 450 archival units
Records on the production, sales, general business development, real estate, and bookkeeping of the steelworks founded in 1870 and acquired by Krupp in 1886.
Finding aids: card index
- **Grusonwerk, Magdeburg-Buckau** 1772–1981, 2 linear meters
Fragmentary holdings of collected records on the history and activity of the shipyard with machine works and iron foundry established by Hermann Gruson in 1855, acquired by Krupp in 1893, expropriated in 1945, and continued as a state-owned enterprise.
Records on the history of the Gruson family, 1772–1981, with individual references to the company, especially the takeover by Krupp.
Finding aids: electronic finding aid, card index More extensive records are held by the Landeshauptarchiv (main regional archive) in Magdeburg.
- **Widiafabrik/Widia GmbH, Essen** 1926–1984, approx. 75 linear meters
Records on the history of the hard metal operation that emerged in 1926 from a department of the Krupp cast steel factory in Essen, and on the technical development of Widia products.

- **Stahlbau/Industrietechnik, Rheinhausen** 1906–1978, approx. 45 linear meters plus 130 archival units

Records of the structural steel workshop established in 1907 at the Friedrich-Alfred-Hütte in Rheinhausen, known as Stahlbau Rheinhausen from 1941, concerning organization and administration, plant construction and mechanical engineering, and association matters.

- **Polysius AG Dessau and Polysius GmbH/AG, Neubeckum** 1841–1981, 4 linear meters

Fragmentary holdings of collected individual records on the history of Polysius AG, originally based in Dessau, active in Neubeckum after the Second World War, and acquired by Fried. Krupp GmbH in 1970/71, and of the Polysius family.

Finding aids: card index More extensive records are held by the Landeshauptarchiv (main regional archive) in Magdeburg.

- **Heinrich Koppers AG/GmbH, Essen** 1891–1980, approx. 120 linear meters

Records on the development of the company founded by Heinrich Koppers in Essen in 1901 and acquired by Krupp in 1974; records relating to management, technical matters, project execution, patent matters, and bookkeeping.

Finding aids: electronic finding aids, card indexes

- **Germaniawerft, Kiel-Gaarden** 1915–1950, 45 linear meters and 300 archival units

Records on the general business development of the shipyard founded in 1863 by Christian Bruhn, which, as Schiff- und Maschinenbau AG Germania, was acquired by Krupp in 1902; in particular on the construction of diesel engines for ships and locomotives, marine turbines, marine boilers, and submarines; patent and licensing matters as well as foreign connections.

Finding aids: electronic finding aid

- **Aktiengesellschaft „Weser“, Bremen** 1850–1980, approx. 65 linear meters

Collected individual records on the history of the iron foundry and machine works Waltjen & Leonhardt, founded in 1843, trading as AG Weser from 1872, part of Deutsche Schiff- und Maschinenbau-Aktiengesellschaft from 1926, and part of Fried. Krupp AG from 1941 following the acquisition of a majority interest, as well as of incorporated works.

Records on shipbuilding, patents, licenses, and the business development of the company.
